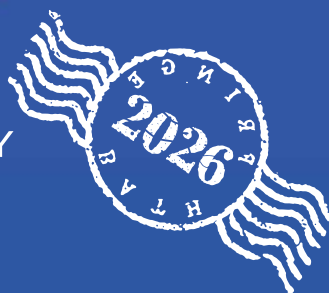

BOX OFFICE

All Fringe gigs this year that aren't free entry should have tickets for sale on the door. The exception is, of course, when they're sold out already: to prevent that spoiling your night out, **BUY YOUR TICKETS IN ADVANCE**. This also helps show organisers, artists, and it can make things easier & quicker on the night.

Many shows have online advance ticketing: when we know what service is handling that (mostly we do), we've

named them in the listing. Most online ticket agents make a charge; in some cases the artist or venue has absorbed the charge into the overall ticket price [some venues have their own ticketing]. Note also, for example, that The Rondo charges a Theatre Restoration Levy of £1.50 per ticket and an additional fee for telephone bookings (and we love The Rondo so we'd also love to see it further restored).

The Fringe website www.bathfringe.co.uk

should have direct links to the relevant booking pages, but you can always search if you're on the right site. The Fringe website will also carry details of any show we know to be sold out. If you want to buy your tickets from an actual person, you can if the booking options include Bath Box Office, next to The Forum at 1a Forum Buildings, Bath BA1 1UG, 01225 4633625; it's open Monday-Friday 10am-5pm except Bank Holidays.

GETTING AROUND THE FESTIVAL

Bath is a small city and easy to get round on foot, but it's also well served by city buses into the evening.

Larkhall (Rondo Theatre) is on buses 6A&7.

Burdall's Yard is an easy stroll from the centre, but also on bus routes via London Road, eg. 3, 13, X31, 231, 228, 271, 272, 273. Those same buses would take you to Lambridge, for the Avon Rugby and Football Club field, and also not far at all from Larkhall.

Bath University is on regular buses U1 & U2, also U3, U5 and probably more, but NB the timetable changes half-way through Fringe time and is much reduced thereafter.

Bath Jewish Burial Ground is in Combe Down on bus.2

Roseberry Rd, use 5, 5a, U5

Roper Theatre, Hayesfield Girls School is close by bus 12, but not far at all [and downhill] from a stop on the Wells Road [St. Mary's Buildings] from which you can equally have pretty level access to the Magdalen Chapel on Holloway - 171-5, 4, 8, 13, D2

Bus 19 will take you to Fairfield House, It would also take you to the bottom of a fairish hill below Kelson Barn, though it's definitely worth it when you get there. Return journeys may have stopped before the end of the show tho'.

To get to Radstock on a Sunday you need bus 174.

Getting Back Late

Trains run back to Bristol late, at minimum frequency about hourly, until just after 1am, except on Sunday when it's 23.35. The last train to Chippenham, Swindon, and on to London leaves at 23.05 every night; on Saturdays it's 22.45 but there's a 23.44 to Chippenham & Swindon, on Sunday 22.43. You can get back to Bradford-on-Avon, Trowbridge, Westbury & Frome till 00.04 on a weekday, and 23.24 on Saturday, and to the first 3 of those at 23.43 on Sunday, but Frome is ignored on Sunday when the last train is 21.07. Check engineering work and timetable changes if you're aiming for the last one of the

night, there's a bit of Replacement Bus bug about

Buses to Bristol via Saltford & Keynsham run all night at least hourly till 03.10 (except Sunday, at 23.00, and there are now night buses to the suburbs from Bristol city centre. Buses run to Bradford & Trowbridge till 23.15 every day (23.20 Saturday) except Sunday (20.22); and to Frome at 23.20 except for Saturday when it's 23.25, but don't even think about it on Sundays (18.55) – what is it with Frome and Sundays? You can head back to Radstock & Norton and even Paulton, Chewton Mendip or Wells at 00.10 except on Sundays when it's a pretty decent 23.10 - on Saturdays, Peasedown even gets an 00.50; Box, Corsham & Chippenham get a late bus on weekdays at 23.10, and 23.20 on Saturdays; Melksham & Devizes get a 23.15 on weekdays, 23.20 Saturdays, but coming back from Sin City Bath on a Sunday evening is officially gallivanting, and you can't do it.

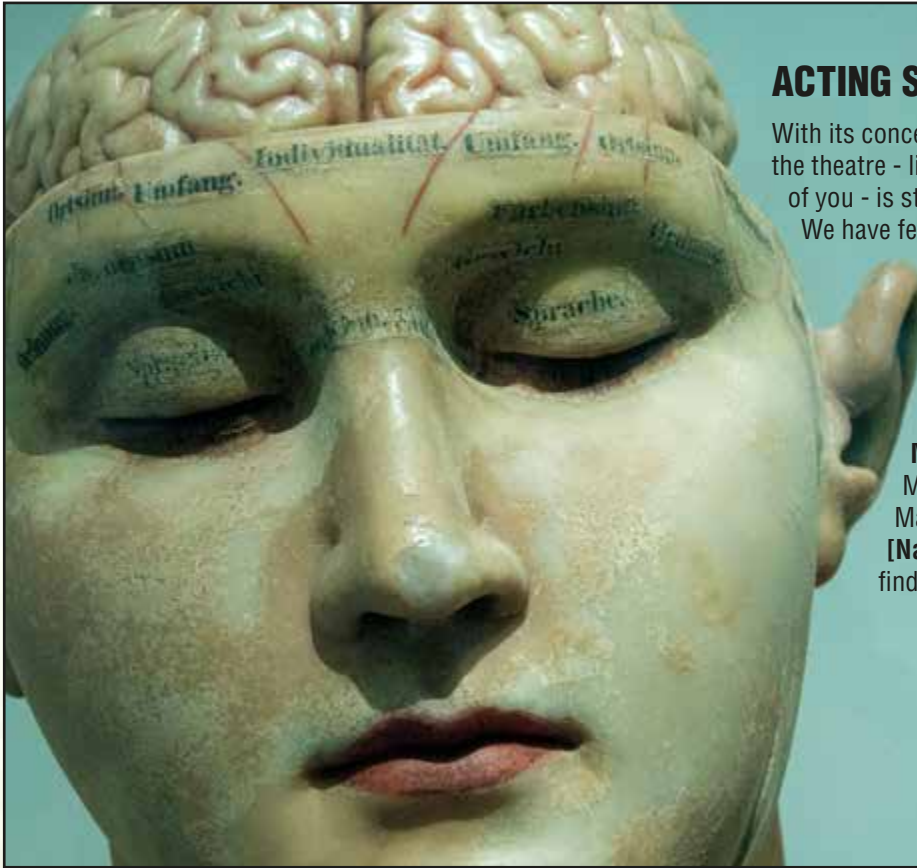

LAUGHS LAST

Comedy is so much the top banana in Fringe land now, that it's hard to remember that there was a time when comedy clubs were rarities, and standup was still mostly driven off the telly. Oh, but we do. Our first Fringes in the early 1990s were around the time the art of standup properly broke out of London & Edinburgh, and one of the outfits who did that in Bath, and did that with the Fringe, was **The Fez Comedy Club**, this year celebrating 30 years is it really... bookending this year's festival with shows from **Nigel Young Ones Planer** and **Ed Byrne** [May 22 & June 5]. Not to be outdone (they're great mates actually) **Bath Comedy Festival** have created a mini-festival over the Bank Holiday at Walcot Street's Hilton Bath hotel: with a bill including **Frank Sanazi & Sol Bernstein** it's still edgy and (ironically) relevant. We also recently made the acquaintance of **The Jesters Comedy Club** under The Assembly Inn on Alfred Street, a very Fringe operation in all the best senses: if you've got nothing to do on any evening of the fortnight, chances are they'll have a show on - see our website (or theirs).

MUSIC TO YOUR EARS

Bath is busy for music all year round, but the Fringe still brings new experiences! Our collaboration with promoter/agency Fair Endeavours has some serious cult artists visiting town, like Irish songcharmer **Fionn Regan** [May 28] and Gong/Cardiacs guitar wiz **Kavus Torabi** [June 6]. **Adrian Utley** is - in both creativity and sales - one of the Westcountry's legends of contemporary popular music: his concert of June 5 will connect him to others of genius. Our 'Studio Presents' series at The Bell shows off emerging bands who are actively recording and gigging and happening right now, one more event than last year, get in on the ground floor of the next generation's legends. The Bell's

own promotions bring us a fortnight of new artists including mould-breaking Glasgow/Japanese spiritual jazz, psychedelia stone groovers **Ari Tsugi** [May 30] and more from independent promoters *Gopherit* and new name *Onda de Amor* [**Soma Soma**, June 7]. The Grapes has year-round top favourites like young jazzers **Salt Beef Reuben** [May 29] and mature bluesmaster **Jon Amor** [May 24]. **Jon Pickard** is back with his Harp Guitar [May 23 & June 6] and high-energy concert pianist **Nurry Lee** is back with violinist friend Yoonseo Oh playing cinema and classical 'lollipops' to a world-ranking standard [May 25]. And perhaps the last word in virtuosos should go to violinist Christian Garrick,

who brings his **Budapest Café Orchestra** [May 23], to play folk music of the East and North, early jazz, and arrangements of the famous 'art-music' works that they inspired.

WHO KNOWS?

It wouldn't be a Fringe at all if it didn't have some events we have no pigeonhole for, apart from the one marked 'unclassifiable'. **WiFi Wars**, a participatory live game show [May 27]; **The Migratory Bird** [May 23], Movement Art, not mime, not dance, not live art; **Kilter Theatre's** half performance, half lecture, half things not quite adding up [June 5]. And of course there's a proper-job magic cabaret show [**Rabbits Out Of The Hat**, May 28], everybody knows what it is but no-one knows how they do it; or for the more curious and less credulous, the same venue (The Rondo) has a family Science Magic show, **Top Secret**, on May 30.

TAKEOUTS

Fringe takes performance to places you don't expect it: **Kilter Theatre** in a lecture room [June 5]; **Natural Theatre** on the street [May 25]; **Sam Grief** dancing with you in Brunel Square, even if you're sitting down [June 3]; **Clare Reddaway** telling the tales Bath would rather forget, where they happened [May 23, 24, 28, 30, 31]. Also outdoors, or outdoorsish, are two multi-input music events, the local/student band meet-up that is **Applefest** [May 30, Green Park Station] and new event, a community connection afternoon over dance music and other hi-jinks, **Beats Beyond Borders**, [June 4, Lambridge Sports Ground]; if you want a classic afternoon in a park, try **Radstock Fayre** on May 31. Bring us sunshine!

OFF THE WALL

From 1977-83 the **Bath Printshop** occupied various premises on and around the London Road, for most of that time and most memorably in Longacre, where there is now a posh kitchen showroom; above was the Longacre Hall gig and community centre. For the cost of materials you could screen-print posters for your band, your meeting, your campaign; you could learn how, too: screenprinting was an essential skill, and you could get quite a few done before the design wore out. There is a bit more history in the excellent 'Bath Arts

Workshop - Counterculture in the 1970s' book [still available!].

On the demise last year of one of the prime movers, Nigel Leach, a stash of posters was discovered; a bit more looking - and the collaboration of the other founding figure, Louise Ingham - revealed more: and we started feeling there was an exhibition in it. Which there proved to be. More than one!

There was also a world of stories: every band, sound system, campaign group, every venue or community centre, holds a tale of a Bath that is not so very different from today, but which held all these different institutions.

We've tracked down a number of those stories too. Two things stood out to us. One, all the community spaces and gig rooms that are no more - mostly casualties of the Bath property boom of the '90s and beyond, re-gentrification in this case. Two, nearly all the campaign issues that posters were shouting about are still issues today: housing, pollution, nuclear weapons, American interventionism... Ever thought "I told you so..."?

Some Bath Spa University students - from the same course that produces our cover/poster artist every year - got excited too, and made excellent work in the same spirit with the same techniques.
